Emergency Response Preparedness (ERP)



Why is having an emergency preparedness plan necessary?

During the onset (first three to four weeks) of any emergency, *a plan must be in place* to ensure a timely, effective and efficient response. The aim of an Emergency Response Preparedness (ERP) is to optimize the speed and volume of assistance delivery by focusing on the initial phase of an emergency and doing so in a coordinated manner.

The ERP approach and guide help countries to be prepared for and respond to emergencies. Embracing the ERP approach *will strengthen* Nutrition Clusters/sectors' capacities to implement and scale up a timely and coordinated response to prevent death and protect the nutritional status of the affected population during emergencies, or in contexts of fragility. It also contributes to resilience building and countries' wider Disaster Risk Reduction plans.

The GNC ERP step-by-step guide includes:

- Brief instructions
- When and whom to engage during each step of the planning process
- Guiding questions to support the thinking around each step
- Tips and recommendations
- Examples of Preparedness actions


What is your current level of emergency preparedness and readiness?

We encourage the use of the tool periodically to measure your progress toward reaching a higher level of nutrition emergency preparedness and readiness.
